## RESOLUTION

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**WHEREAS**, the contract for the supply of salt for the 2008 winter season was awarded to the low bidder of the State of Illinois' annual salt letting, said low bidder being North American Salt of Oakland Park, Kansas; and

**WHEREAS**, said low bidder has supplied Lake County with the full tonnage of salt as called for in the terms and conditions of said contract and is unable to supply any additional salt for the remainder of the 2008 winter season; and

**WHEREAS**, this County Board of Lake County Illinois at its meeting of February 12, 2009 confirmed the emergency award of a contract with Cargill Salt Co., North Olmstead, Ohio for the supply of an additional 5,000 tons of ice control salt for the remainder of the 2008 winter season; and

**WHEREAS**, subsequent to this award, said Cargill Salt Co., began deliveries at the rate of three semi loads per day; and

**WHEREAS**, said delivery rate of ice control salt was inadequate to supply the Lake County Division of Transportation with enough inventory to manage snow events; and

**WHEREAS**, on February 7, 2008, there existed an immediate need for the acquisition of birdseye stone to be blended with the salt on hand to stretch the supply of ice control salt; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with Article 6-103 of the Lake County Purchasing Ordinance, the County Engineer of Lake County declared that an emergency existed; and

**WHEREAS**, by prior resolution, this County Board appropriated \$30,000.00 of Matching Tax funds to provide for the acquisition of additional ice control materials; and

**WHEREAS**, Lake County by and through its Division of Transportation has requested price quotes for the supply of birdseye stone for the remainder of the 2008 winter season, a tabulation of said quotes as follows:

**WHEREAS**, in order to alleviate said emergency, contracts were awarded for the supply of birdseye stone to Thelen Sand and Gravel, Antioch, Illinois, at the unit price of \$11.00 per ton and to Kirschhoffer Trucking, Wadsworth, Illinois at the unit price of \$10.95 per ton.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by this County Board of Lake County, Illinois, that the Chair of the County Board, the County Clerk and the Purchasing Agent be and they are hereby directed to confirm emergency contracts to Thelen Sand and Gravel, Antioch, Illinois, at the unit price of \$11.00 per ton and to Kirschhoffer Trucking, Wadsworth, Illinois at the unit price of \$10.95 per ton.
